SAT (test-optional at many)	1400–1580 for top universities if submitted
ACT (alternative to SAT)	32–36 for Ivy League and top-tier universities
IELTS	7.0+ overall for most universities
TOEFL iBT	100–110 for top universities
A Level / IGCSE Grades	Minimum AAB at A Level; A* grades highly valued

Common App Essays	Critical component — 650-word personal essay required
Extracurriculars	Research projects, leadership, sports, community service
Recommendation Letters	2–3 letters from teachers and school counsellors
Application System	Common App (commonapp.org) — used by 900+ universities

Early Decision / Early Action	November 1–15	ED is binding; EA is non-binding
Regular Decision	January 1–15	Standard for most international students
CSS Profile (Financial Aid)	Same as application deadline	Apply simultaneously with Common App
Fulbright Application	October each year	Via USEFP Pakistan — usefpakistan.org
I-20 / F-1 Student Visa	After acceptance letter received	SEVIS fee + DS-160 + embassy interview
OPT Application (after graduation)	Up to 90 days before graduation	File via university DSO office

PAKISTANI QUALIFICATION EQUIVALENCY

Pakistani Qualification	Equivalent	Notes
A Level A*/A (3 subjects)	US High School diploma + may earn college credit	Some schools grant AP-equivalent credit
IGCSE / O Level (5+ subjects)	US High School partial credit	Accepted alongside A Levels
Matric + FSc	Considered case-by-case at US universities	SAT score may strengthen application
Pakistani CGPA (grad school)	Converted to US 4.0 scale — WES evaluation required	wes.org for official evaluation

PRO TIPS FOR PAKISTANI STUDENTS

1. Apply via Common App — one application reaches up to 20+ universities simultaneously.
2. Essays are the most important part of your US application — start drafting in June.
3. Harvard, MIT, Princeton, and Yale offer full financial aid — apply even if you cannot afford tuition.
4. Fulbright is Pakistan's best route to a fully-funded US Masters — apply through USEFP, not directly.

5. For graduate school, aim for universities that offer Teaching/Research Assistantships — these cover tuition entirely.
